## **Detailed Itinerary**

## Day 01: Day 1, arrive Warsaw, Friday

You are met and transferred to the hotel. There will be plenty of time to relax before meeting your fellow travelers and Tour Director. (D)

## Day 02: Day 2, in Warsaw, Saturday

This 700-year-old capital is the symbol of the Polish nationhood and the will to survive against great odds. A sightseeing tour here includes a drive along the famous Royal Route from magnificent Castle Square to Lazienki Park and Palace, the summer residence of the last King of Poland. Pass by the Palace of Science and Culture (known as the "Wedding Cake"), the Saxon Gardens, Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Monument to the Heroes of the Warsaw Ghetto, and the Barbican. Continue with a walking tour of the Old Town, Old Market Square, and St. John's Cathedral. The rest of the day is free for relaxing, shopping, going for a stroll through the city or an optional late afternoon Chopin concert. (B)

## Day 03: Day 3, Warsaw to Poznan and Berlin, Sunday

Stop in Poznan for an orientation tour of this trade center. Then on to Berlin, for a dinner and free evening. (B, D)

## Day 04: Day 4, in Berlin, Monday

Your morning sightseeing tour features the Reichstag, the Renaissance building that once housed Germany's Parliament, and the lovely Schloss Charlottenburg. The tour continues through the city to view other famous sights such as the Opera, Schiller Theater and Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church. The afternoon is free to explore this once divided city on your own. (B)

## Day 05: Day 5, Berlin to Dresden and Prague, Tuesday

Continue your journey via Dresden, the beautiful Saxony Baroque city. On an orientation tour, view the Zwinger Palace and Semper Opera House. Then it's on to the Czech capital of Prague, the "City of 100 Spires". (B, D)

## Day 06: Day 6, in Prague, Wednesday

## Tour Warsaw, Berlin & Prague #1438



Built on seven hills more than 1000 years ago and spread over both banks of the river Vltava, Prague is one of the most attractive cities in Europe. Your sightseeing tour starts with panoramic drive to famous Wenceslas Square, the Strahov Stadium and Castle Square. Continue with a walking tour, and visit the Royal Castle of Hradcany with Cathedral of St. Vitus, Old Royal Palace, St. George's Basilica and Golden Lane with the Daliborka Tower. Cross the Charles Bridge and walk through the old quarter of Prague to view the Jewish Ghetto, Town Hall and the world-famous Astronomical Clock. The rest of the day is free. An optional cultural performance will be available. Ask your Tour Director for details. (B)

## Day 07: Day 7, depart Prague, Thursday

After breakfast, transfer to Prague's airport for your departure flight. (B)

#### WARSAW / WILANOW PALACE

This splendid baroque palace, as impressive as Versailles, was built in the late 17th century as a summer residence for King Jan Sobieski III and owned later by most important polish noble families. The main building consisting of 3 wings, housed the oldest museum established in Poland in 1805 to preserve the memory about Sobieski family and spectacular national history moments of that time, including Battle of





Vienna in 1683 against the Ottoman Empire. The residence complex extended by a large garden and lakeside promenade, fortunately, avoided deeper destruction in 1939-1945. After detailed renovations in 2010-11, Wilanow Palace presents its valuable collection of royal furniture, portraits, and China.

#### WARSAW / CHOPIN CONCERT

It was the genius of Frederic Chopin that made Poland's music world famous. The Mazurkas, Etudes, Polonaises, and Scherzos became a test and measure of any pianist's talent. Enjoy a **Chopin piano recital**, performed just for you in a setting fit for a king. A glass of champagne is served during intermission.

#### BERLIN / VISIT OF THE LOCAL BREWERY WITH BEER TASTING

Join us as we taste amazing local craft beer, visit craft brewery and learn all about the drinking culture and history of beer in Berlin.

#### PRAGUE / VLTAVA RIVER CRUISE WITH COFFEE AND CAKE

Transfer to the Vltava River where an air-conditioned boat awaits you. During one-hour cruise along the Vltava River, with coffee and cake served, you will enjoy fantastic views of Prague. See its famous buildings and historic monuments, such as St. Agnes Monastery, the Rudolfinum, Charles' Bridge, majestic Prague Castle, the National Theatre, Vysehrad and more.

#### PRAGUE / DINNER WITH FOLKLORE SHOW

Experience an evening of typical Czech hospitality, with dinner, wine, music, and dance. Wine is served from special glass pipes, which are used in the wine cellars of Southern Moravia. You will listen to folk music from different parts of the country, starting with traditional music, and followed by a program of Bohemian, Moravian, and Slovakian folk songs and dances, and gypsy songs and dances. You will have an opportunity to see typical folk instruments, such as the hammer-dulcimer, fujara (shepherds-whistle) and bag-pipe. After a break, the musicians will play international music according to the guests' wishes and at the end of the evening, you will listen to some famous pieces of classical music.
