Day 01: Arrive Buenos Aires

Arrival at Ezeiza International Airport (EZE) - Meet with guide and private transfer to hotel. Welcome amenities on board. Includes: leather clutch, premium snacks, mineral water, Buenos Aires city guide, postcards with stamps & printed program. Suggested Optional (Not included - In addition): VIP International Arrivals Service | EZE Airport Guests are met as soon as they leave the aircraft in the boarding bridge and they are escorted to the VIP lounge where they can have something to drink or just relax for a few minutes. Once the luggage porters have their baggage ready, guests are escorted through immigration and customs without doing the line to their guide or driver. Buenos Aires is one of the most fascinating cities in both Latin America and the world. Be it for its splendid and varied architecture, with its old Colonial buildings, French palaces and state-of-the-art skyscrapers; for its vibrant nightlife and endless cultural options; or maybe just for the rich identity of the Porteños, who proudly bear the European heritage of their ancestors, more and more visitors are coming to visit. Visit Plaza de Mayo, the city's foundational site and witness of our country's political history. There we'll visit the Pink House, our Presidential Palace, the Cabildo, our primitive town hall, and the Neoclassical-style Metropolitan Cathedral, the final home of Argentina's founding father, José de San Martín. We'll come across sumptuous French palaces again in Palermo Chico, the area of Palermo best known for its large parks designed by celebrated landscape architects, such as the illustrious Frenchman Charles Thays. In Retiro and Recoleta, we will learn about the dream of our local aristocrats in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, when they sought to build a small-scale Paris in the heart of Buenos Aires. After visiting the impressive Plaza San Martín, where Jorge Luis Borges used to take his walks, we'll stroll down Avenida Alvear, chosen by the world's most distinguished brands to install their exclusive boutiques, looking up to see the many wonderful French-style palaces which nowadays house a number of embassies. Then we'll visit the Basílica de Nuestra Señora del Pilar, one of the city's oldest churches, which dates to the Colonial era. Finally, we'll admire the celebrated Recoleta Cemetery, a true labyrinth of ornate mausoleums. We'll make a stop at Eva Peron's grave, one of the country's most recognizable icons. We'll visit Puerto Madero, the latest addition to the city's barrios. In 1991, its huge warehouses and silos were remodeled and redesigned, to finally integrate the river to the city and to create a new corporative, residential, hotel and gastronomically district, which has become the playground for the pretty Porteños and the international jet-set. We'll then head for San Telmo, one of the oldest neighborhoods in Buenos Aires. It used to be the residential district favored by the upper class until the late 19th century when a yellow fever epidemic caused the wealthier families to leave northwards. The area was marginalized until the 1970s when many artists and artisans came to San Telmo to install their workshops. Nowadays, thanks to its amazing architecture and hip atmosphere, this ancient neighborhood is really blooming. We'll walk its cobbled streets, where the city's Colonial past seems to come back to life, making a stop at Plaza Dorrego, best known for its traditional antiques fair, held every Sunday. Leaving San Telmo behind, we'll continue southwards to La Boca, one of the city's most authentic and charming neighborhoods. It is a working-class district, heavily shaped by Italian immigrants who came to our country in large numbers during the last quarter of the 19th century. Here, we'll make a special visit to the mythical Caminito Street, which sums up everything that gives La Boca its distinctive spirit: the strong passion for soccer, the heavy presence of art and color, and the Tango-esque atmosphere. Enjoy Lunch at Cauce Restaurant 3-course meal with half bottle of wine per person | Tips are not included. Located in the neighbourhood of Puerto Madero, Cauce presents a modern menu blessed by the quality of noble, selected products. Here you can enjoy a new concept, which is characterized by the most varied and delicious signature cocktails, international cuisine and a unique atmosphere for your celebration. Observations: Daily

departures. Lunch can be organized in a different restaurant and in other areas of the city. 4 hours are usually dedicated to cover full itinerary and 2 hours for lunch time. The Cafe Tortoni epitomizes the "porteño café", but little is known about its origins. Just that a French immigrant named Touan decided to open it at the end of 1858, and that the name was taken from an establishment on Boulevard des Italians, where the elites of Parisian culture used to meet up. By the end of the century, the bar was purchased by another Frenchman: Don Celestino Curutchet, who the poet Allende Iragorri describes as a typical wise, old Frenchman, small in stature but strong in spirit, with several days' stubble and lively eyes, who wore an Arab silk black cap, almost reminiscent of a comic book character, adding another intriguing quirk to the café's ambiance. The place was frequented by a group of painters, writers, journalists, and musicians who formed the "Agrupación de Gente de Artes y Letras" (Arts and Letters Association), led by Benito Quinquela Martín. In May 1926 they formed La Peña and asked Don Celestino Curutchet to let them use the basement cellar. The owner was happy to accept as, in his words, the artists did not spend much, but gave the café a bit of luster and fame. In this café, time seems to have stood still like an old photograph when people used to come here to play billiards, cards, or just to share a coffee with friends. With each day that passes, the place becomes an ever more indispensable part of the history of Buenos Aires. Observations: This remarkable café opens every day from 08:00 AM to 01:00 AM. Explore one of the most important opera houses in the world! How many architects participated in the construction of Colon Theatre? How long did they take? What are the main local and international figures that adorned the theatre in its vast history? How are the corridors that these artists have travelled? The Colon Theatre keeps secrets in every corner and to live the experience of a Guided Tour is to know a portion of its history of more than one hundred years at the service of the Argentine and world culture. Touring the Hall, the Main Foyer, the Gallery of Busts and the Golden Hall, visitors can absorb amazing details about the architecture, the stairs, their sculptures, ceilings or vitreaux during the 50 minute visit. Its rich and prestigious history and its exceptional acoustics and architectural features rank it among theatres such as Teatro alla Scala in Milan, the Paris Opera House, the Vienna State Opera, the Royal Opera House in London, and the Metropolitan Opera House in New York. In the beginning, the theatre recruited opera companies from other countries, but as of 1925 it has had its own permanent companies (orchestra, ballet and choir) and its own production workshops, which have allowed the theatre to organize its own seasons since the 1930s, founded by the city budget. Since then, the Colón renewed its repertoire annually, and has been able to set up whole productions on its own because of the professionalism of its specialized stagecraft staff. Day 03: Buenos Aires - Bariloche

Private transfer from hotel to Domestic Airport (AEP) with your English speaking guide in order to take flight to Bariloche. Mineral water on board. Flight from Buenos Aires to Bariloche - Not included. Arrival at Bariloche (BRC) Airport - Meet with your ALCHEMY DMC Argentina guide and private transfer to hotel. Mineral water included on board. According to flight schedule, transfers can be arranged directly to hotel, or straight to the activity for the day. San Carlos de Bariloche is a city in the province of Río Negro, the biggest city of the huge Lakes District. It is situated on the foothills of the Andes, next to the limits of Nahuel Huapi National Park and at 1,575 kilometers from Buenos Aires. The city is surrounded by breath-taking lakes and mountains and it is famous for skiing along with its architectonic style. Bariloche is the perfect base for you to enjoy many excursions in the region such as water sports, trekking and climbing. Welcome Hike with Mate tasting, enjoy breath-taking Nahuel Huapi Lake views Private experience | Vehicle and English Trekking Guide at disposal | Half Day - Duration: 3hs 30 min | Snacks on board | Welcome mate tasting and Chairlift to Campanario Hill are included. We know that travelling by plane allows geographical movement, but getting to a place and getting to know it makes it a much deeper art: it is knowing, connecting, interpreting and learning about a culture. That is what the Welcome Hike is about, it is connecting you with the place, its diversity, its situations and attractions to begin to understand why you made the decision to visit it. By knowing its small ceremonies, its little secrets, when you start to breathe and feel its smells, we begin to imbue you with the feeling and value of being in Patagonia. First, we cross the steppe, we see the mountains, the ski centre, discovering the lake, the possibility of traversing

through Bariloche from end to end and go along the route of Av. Bustillo. Taking a quiet walk through the forest while catching sight of the incredible surroundings, is the best way to approach Patagonia. This walk in the forest goes through a trail with gentle slopes that allows you to see coihues, cypresses and other native trees. The path leads to a viewpoint of Nahuel Huapi Lake, ideal to admire stunning landscapes. There, glaciers in the high mountains, native forests, and islands that unfold in the arms of the lake tell a story of thousands of years. Sounds of nature, birds chirping, wind sneaking between the tops of the trees and the murmur of water at our feet, will keep us company throughout the entire walk. This natural beauty comes together in the perfect moment to enjoy and share a spectacular welcoming experience hosted by Pachi and her charming character when we arrive at a secret viewpoint with an imposing scenery, chosen to sit down, drink mate and taste typical homemade delicacies. For us having a mate is a ritual, it belongs to our culture and it means time for sharing. We know that when a friend invites you to have some mate, something is going to happen. At the end of the walk, we will have breathed in deep and for the first time the air of Patagonia. The vehicle will undertake the return to the city and leave the guests at their hotel. DATA SHEET

Day 04: Bariloche

Andes Trail with Kayak Experience and Nomad Lunch Private Service (Personalized) | Vehicle and English speaking guide at disposal | Duration: Half Day (6 hours) | Includes equipment for activities and Gourmet outdoor lunch | Mineral water on board. This excursion combines the best in Patagonia for you to have an unforgettable day! Your guide will pick you up with a private transportation at the lobby of your hotel at 10:30 AM to take you to this day's program. The adventure begins by walking the oldest trekking path in Patagonia, the one that the Palotinos priests pilgrimaged to get to the long-standing refuge of Cerro López.

This historic path was once dreamed of as a crossroads to Chile and nowadays it's a place of adventure among mountains. Little by little while wandering through ancient coihue forests that rise parallel to the rocks carved by glaciers, we see opening windows through their branches and each one of them gives us a new view and a new discovery. This is the part of the adventure where we turn into climbers: scrambling step by step between boulders, helping and accompanying each other, every time we turn back a new angle of the landscape is presented to us. Arriving at our first summit, we participate in a small ritual bringing a rock to the stone pyramid sitting a-top. From there a small trek leads to the stone of the Lion King, a natural balcony over Brazo Tristeza where the background is governed by the majestic Cerro Tronador. Things that seemed to make no sense, come before us to invite us to rappel: a technique for descending the mountain that allows us to know ourselves, to challenge our inner-self. We equip ourselves and descend. We are ready to return, but before that there is a pause for contemplation: lunch. A moment to relax, connect and learn stories about the native Tehuelches, their culture and how they cooked in ancient times. Before leaving, a tea gives us one last warm relief and again the wind will be bringing us a present: the music of a guitar or a charango that draws us the perfect company. We start our descent and on the way down we realize that we are only halfway there. We cross the Gandalf Bridge, and follow the Flintstones trail until we reach the Brazo Tristeza viewpoint and continue down to the beach. Here, we will spot our kayaks, inviting us to tour the aquatic world of Lake Nahuel Huapi. From the buoyancy we take full delightment of the landscapes rowing from the Nahuel Huapi to Moreno Lake. From there, protected by the reeds and the bays, we reach our final point, from where we take our private transfer back to the hotel, unless you're staying at the Hotel Llao where we may finish the tour disembarking at its bay. Day 05: Bariloche

Victoria Island Experience with Gourmet Outdoor Lunch Private Service (Personalized) | Vehicle and English speaking guide at disposal | Duration: Half Day (6 hours) | Includes private navigation, trekking & Gourmet outdoor lunch | Mineral water on board. One of our guides will pick you up at the hotels for your private transfer to the pier. We will board a private boat to sail Nahuel Huapi's crystal clear waters for 45 minutes up to this millenary island, while overseeing Cerro López and Cerro Capilla in the surroundings of Tristeza and Blest arms and tasting our cultural Mate along the way. The tour of the Island is lived as a journey through time where we will hike the woodlands through 5, 5 to 8 kilometers of inner trails with an altitude gain of 110 meters (360 feet) up to 900 meters (2995 feet) above sea level. We disembark at Playa del Toro pier where the trekking starts, leading to a first mandatory stop at the cave paintings. Then we head

up to a viewpoint, from where we observe Cerro Millaqueo, Isla de los Gansos and the Andes mountain range that surrounds us. The journey continues to La Escuelita, the local school, a central place of attachment to local people, where we come into contact with their community and understand the importance of the different paradigms of education and contact with different world travel cultures. From there we go down to Totoras, where we reach the other side of the island, outside the traditional circuit, arriving at the beach protected by pataguas, myrtle trees, monkey puzzle trees (male and female) and larch trees. Returning through the Swiss Vallecito up to the Central Zone, go up to the Nursery Garden connecting with the whole process of restoration of native species. The next stop steers directly to the history of the white man in the Island, with the house of Anchorena, the Park Rangers School, and the soon-to-be restored museum. We will talk about the colony that started with the manufacture of boats and the exploitation of lumber. Then we head north along the coastal path to Aserradero Viejo, where we'll play to interpret and compare the original forest with the exotic one and we may listen to different bird species and discover insects. Throughout the hike we can find natural chilcos and if we are silent enough, we can even see deer's or pheasants. Towards the end, we will observe the change of vegetation: from Coihues to Ñires and Cipreses until the great descent that ends at the bay of Antepuerto where a private chef is waiting for us. After lunch, we'll return to the boat with the possibility of navigating to the bay of the sunken ship to keep track of where we were previously. Finally, we start the return to the port on a navigation of relaxation and contemplation while offering drinks, blankets and sunscreen. If weather permits, we may jump off rocks and swim in the Lake! Optional SUP (stand up paddle) activity... Stay Standing has never been so fun!! This is the ideal activity for those looking for challenge! Standing, sitting or on your knees! Stand up Paddle is the closest to paddle on a surf board. The essence of this activity goes back to times in which adventurers sailed the rivers discovering new and wonderful landscapes, standing on homemade rafts, made by tying tree trunks of the region. Nowadays, technology allow us to enjoy this same experience with last generation materials, with a design being novelty worldwide. The adventure is not over yet. There is still another part of the island to discover. We embark on our way to Puerto Pampa, while we let ourselves drown in the beauty of the surroundings. Before returning to embark, we take a breath of air and admire our surroundings once again to say "goodbye" to the island. Day 06: Bariloche - Villa La Angostura

In the morning, enjoy horseback riding and BBQ lunch near the campsite. In the afternoon you will leave the campsite and sail towards Las Balsas private dock in Villa La Angostura... Villa La Angostura is a small town located between Bariloche and San Martin de Los Andes, at only 76 kilometers from San Carlos de Bariloche and more than 1,600 kilometers from Buenos Aires. This touristic destination is surrounded by lakes, ancient forests and the impressive Andean Mountain Range. The combination of these elements gives Villa La Angostura unique views that along with its typical mountain architecture enchant its visitors. In this Patagonian town you find the perfect place to enjoy hiking, climbing or practice any other outdoor activity. 2 overnights accommodations at Las Balsas Hotel Villa La Angostura - Standard Lake with half board included. Inserted in the middle of the first National Park of Argentina, Nahuel Huapi, this property is surrounded by 20 hectares of native forest 83 kilometers away from Bariloche. The natural vastness allows the visitors to enjoy a unique landscape frame. Las Balsas is an ample residence located on the shores of the magical Nahuel Huapi Lake, which offers its guests serenity and relaxation. Day 07: Villa La Angostura

Day 08: Villa La Angostura – Bariloche – Buenos Aires
